- A. A/TC EMS and the OMD continue to develop and refine alternative patient transport programs (ATU, MCOT and direct transport to Psychiatric Facilities). Once finalized and ready for implementation, we will issue additional Medical Directive (s) to incorporate these programs into the COGs.
- B. We have been made aware that Ketamine is one of the medications that is on allocation on a national basis due to demand. At this time A/TC EMS has not been able to secure enough Ketamine to appropriately supply all of the System units that will need it and; provide an appropriate level of resupply stocking needed to support the full implementation of Ketamine. Once enough stock is acquired and ready for deployment, we will issue an additional Medical Directive to incorporate the "System" use of Ketamine into the COGs.
