Austin guide to... EARTH SCHOOL



Earth School is a one-hour, hands-on classroom presentation for fifth graders about Austin's watersheds, the Edwards Aquifer and water quality. Students model water flow in a watershed and aquifer and identify pollution threats in their own neighborhood. Earth School is offered to Austin schools for FREE by the City of Austin's Watershed Protection Department. The content is correlated to the state standards and can enrich other lessons about landforms, water and the environment.

- Define a watershed and an aquifer
- Predict the flow of water in a watershed and aquifer
- Understand surface water and groundwater connections
- Draw the complete water cycle
- Identify pollution threats to waterways and solutions to pollution
